Learning Goal

We are learning to add and subtract decimals accurately.

Success looks like:

- Align decimal points.
- Use placeholders when helpful.
- Estimate before calculating.
- Explain why an answer is reasonable.



Place Value Controls the Alignment

Line up decimal points so equal place values share a column.

Hundreds Tens Ones • Tenths Hundredths Thousandths

$$\begin{array}{r} 23.6 \\ + 4.85 \\ \hline \end{array}$$

Ones stay with ones; tenths stay with tenths; hundredths stay with hundredths.



Prepare the Number

Write trailing placeholder zeros to make the place-value columns easy to see.

$$23.6 = 23.600$$

$$4.785 = 4.785$$

Adding zeros to the end of a decimal does not change its value.



Add Decimals Step by Step

Estimate: $24 + 5 \approx 29$

$$\begin{array}{r} 23.600 \\ + 4.785 \\ \hline \end{array}$$

28.385

Check: 28.385 is close to 29 .



Subtract Decimals Step by Step

Estimate: $52 - 9 \approx 43$

$$\begin{array}{r} 52.400 \\ - 8.750 \\ \hline \end{array}$$

43.650

Check: 43 is close to 43 .



Regroup Across Zeros

Rename 20.000 as 19 ones, 9 tenths, 9 hundredths and 1 thousandths.

Work from right to left and regroup by place value.



Estimate First
