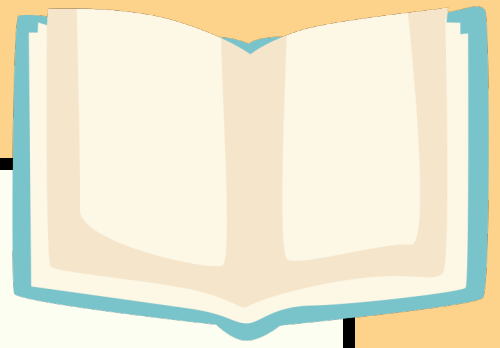




# Learning Goal

# Images Add Meaning

Images can show characters, places, objects and facts.

Good readers look at words and images together.





# Fiction Images

Fiction texts tell made-up stories.

Illustrations can show characters, settings, problems and feelings.





# Non-Fiction Images

Non-fiction texts give information.

Photographs, maps, diagrams, labels and captions can help explain facts.

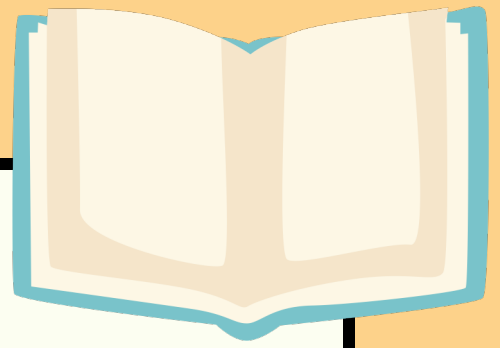




# Illustrations

An illustration is a drawn or digital picture.  
It can make a story easier to imagine.





# Photographs

A photograph shows a real thing, place or event.  
It can help us learn what something looks like.





# Captions

A caption is a short sentence near a picture.  
It explains what the picture shows.





# Labels

A label names a part of an image.  
Labels can help readers find important details.





# Diagrams And Maps

A diagram can show parts or steps.

A map can show where things are.
