Put the echidna far from the platypus, then turn the platypus over.

Place the cockatoo
above the quokka.

Put the echidna
next to the quokka.

Clap once.



Put the kangaroo
behind the wombat.

Put the quokka
between them.

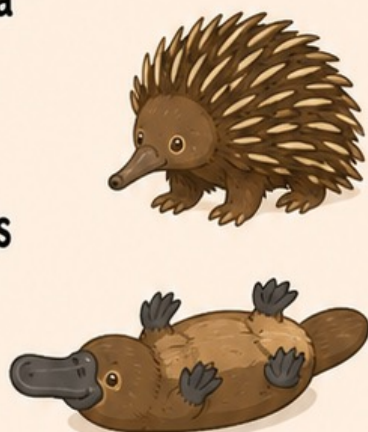

Stand beside your chair.

Move behind your chair.

Sit in front of your chair.

Find a partner where you are.



In, On and Under

An object can be on or under another object.

Example: "The pen is on the table."

Use the same reference object every time.



Above and Below

Above means higher than reference object.

Below means lower than reference object.

Point to something above and below you.



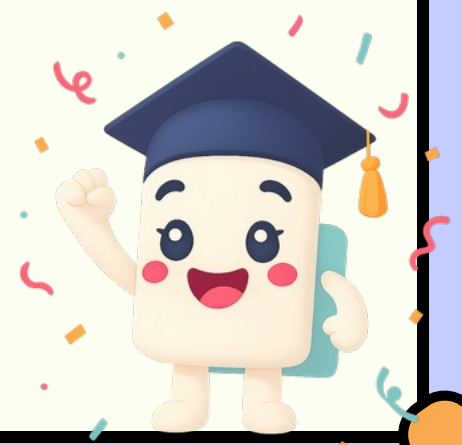
Next To and Beside

Next to and beside are used close at one side.
Use a complete sentence: "The box is beside the bag."



Between

Between means in the middle of two people or objects.
Not both reference objects in your description.



In Front Of and Behind

In front of means before a reference object.

Behind means the back of it.

The reference object helps the listener.



Near and Far

Near means short distance away.

Far means a long distance away.

Distances depend on the chosen reference object.



Inside and Outside

Inside means within a space or boundary.

Outside means beyond it.

Use the space as your reference.



Left and Right

Hold up your hands and make an L.

Use the power's left and right words describing a picture.



Choose a Reference Object

A location description needs a starting point.
Compare the object with a person, place or other object.



Describe Our Classroom

Choose a classroom object.

Describe its position to a reference object.

List how could a partner find it?



Follow One-Step Directions

Listen for the clue and the position word.

Complete one step at a time.

Click your final location.



Follow Two-Step Directions

Hold both steps in your mind.

Complete them in order.

Ask for a direction again if needed.



Move Through Space

Forward moves you ahead.

Turn left or right to change direction.

Use landmarks to keep your place.



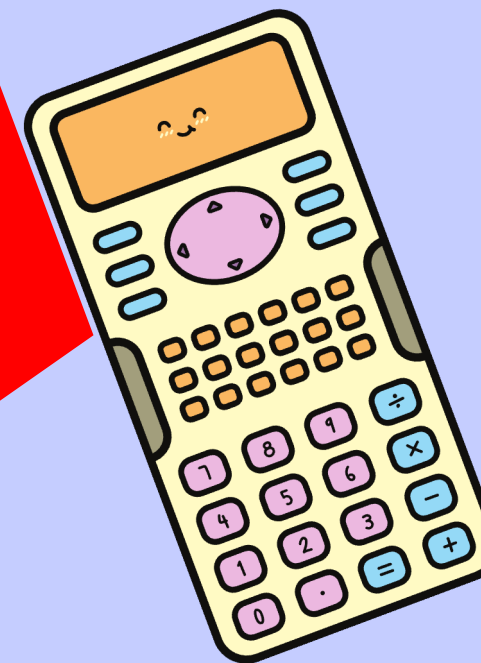
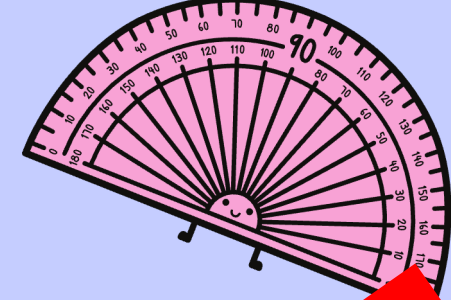
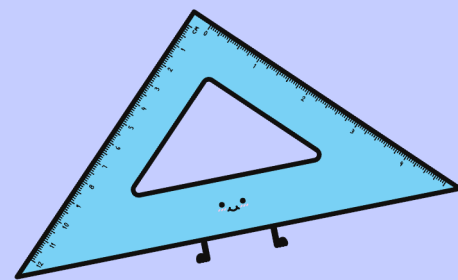
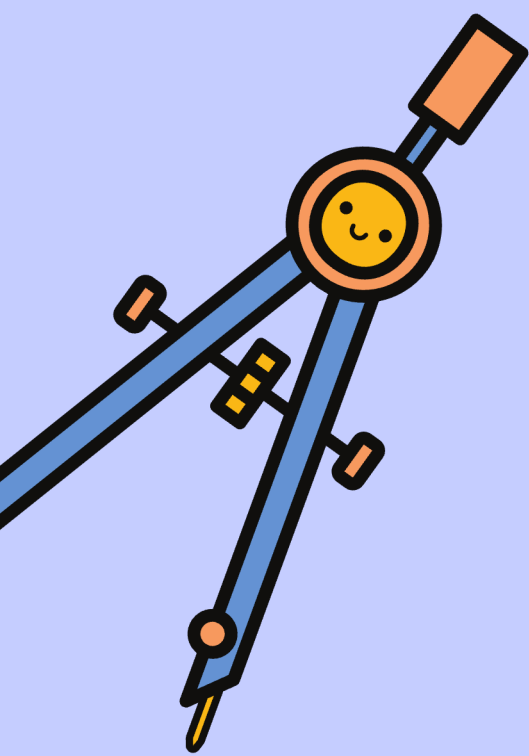
